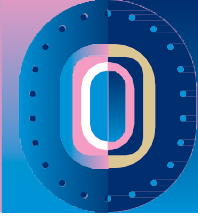


ITINERARY: A TERRITORY OF CINEMA

From training to professional integration structures, associations, private studio companies and key innovative players: Plaine Commune is home to an authentic film industry. More than two hundreds shootings of movies, short films, documentaries and music videos have been made on our territory since 2020.



KEY FACTS

Today, Plaine Commune welcomes companies of national and international stature renowned for their innovative approach. , 15 film studio are located in our territory included : TSF, AMP visual, Studios de Paris -Cité du cinéma, Studios du Lendit, Studio Rouchon, Studio de la Monjoie, Studio d'Epinay-sur-Seine...

It also offers a number of excellent audiovisual training courses, including the Ecole Louis Lumière, the Paris 8 Master's in Cinema, the Paris 8 Master's in Directing and Creation, the Master's in Virtual Image Arts and Technologies and Digital Images and Virtual Reality...

PLAINE COMMUNE LANDSCAPES: OPEN-AIR STUDIOS

Our 9 towns offer exceptional and unusual sceneries, really popular by filmmakers. Since the creation of the first film studios, many French and foreign films have been shot in Plaine Commune, particularly in Saint-Denis, Aubervilliers and Saint-Ouen-sur-Seine, which have special public taskforce for filming and and are already actively collaborating with productions companies. Between 2020 and 2023, around two hundred films, including reports and short films, were shot in the area: the "Lupin" series broadcast on Netflix, "Les trois mousquetaires : Milady" directed by Martin Bourboulon, the Hoshi video, etc.

START : MAISON DU PROJET, PAUL ELUARD MUSEUM, SAINT-DENIS

STAGE 1: A VISIT TO THE MAISON DE LA LÉGION D'HONNEUR

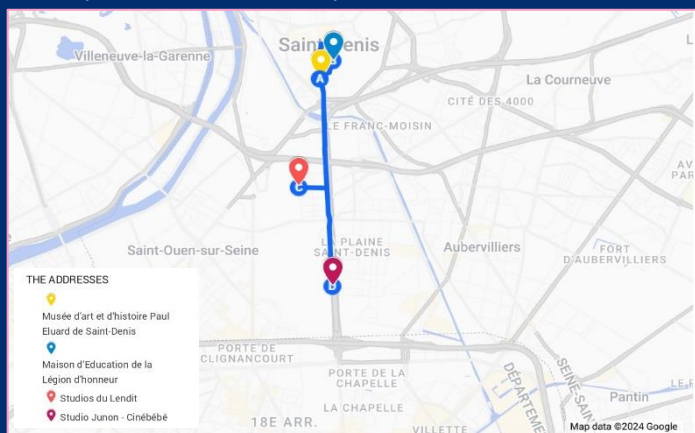
Funded by Napoléon for the education of young girls, and used as the setting for the film "Les trois mousquetaires : Milady" directed by Martin Bourboulon, in 2023.

STAGE 2: VISIT TO THE LENDIT STUDIOS

Located at 14/16 rue André Campra in Saint-Denis La Plaine, the **Lendit studios** claims 5 TV sets with a total surface area of 14,000 m², as well as their associated areas: parking lot, 74 dressing rooms, 4 VIP lounges, 6 production offices, 3 catering areas, post-production rooms and public reception areas.

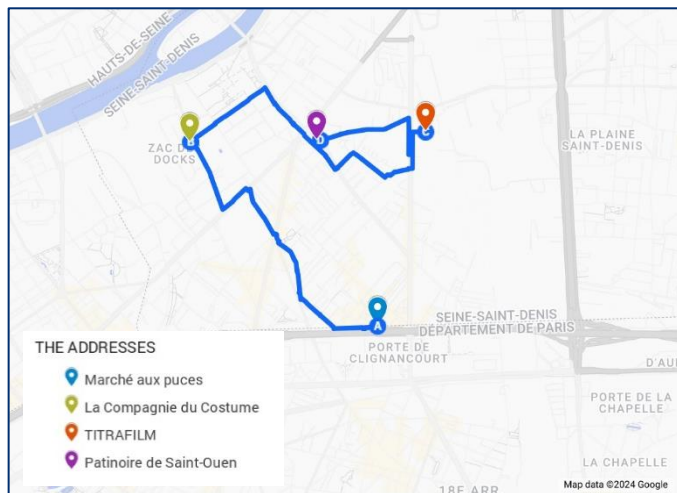
STAGE 3: DISCOVERING THE CINÉBÉBÉCOMPANY

Since 2008, the company has put its expertise in maternity and hyperrealism at the service of the film and audiovisual industries. Cinébébé designs, manufactures and rents out specialized props of "hyperrealistic fake babies, fake pregnancy bellies". It is the only maternity special effects workshop in France.

SAINT-OUEN : ACTION !



START : THE FLEA MARKET, SAINT-OUEN

STAGE 1: THE FLEA MARKET

The world's leading art and antiques market, it has been the setting for film directors since the 1960s, including Claude Barma's 1965 TV series "Belphégor ou le Fantôme du Louvre", and the "Lupin" series created by George Kay and François Uzan and broadcast on Netflix.

STAGE 2: LA COMPAGNIE DU COSTUME

Located in Saint-Ouen-sur-Seine at 50 rue Ardoin, the company manufactures and rents costumes for film, entertainment and festivities. Here are a few film and TV references: Totems, Une affaire française, Les aventures du jeune voltaire.

STAGE 3: TITRA FILM

Located at 11 rue Rolland in Saint-Ouen-sur-Seine, Titra Film, founded in 1933, is France's oldest dubbing and subtitling company for film and television.

ETAPE 4: THE SKATING RINK

Located in Saint-Ouen-sur-Seine at 4 rue du Docteur Bauer. It has been the backdrop for several sites. Since its definitive closure in 2020, the ice rink has been converted into an exhibition space.
