ITINERARY: OLYMPICS 2024 LEGACY



THE 2024 OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC GAMES

With 3 competition venues, the closing ceremonies, several celebration sites, 12 training sites and the Athletes' Village, Plaine Commune will be at the heart of the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games. This event, the biggest in the world, will see 15,000 athletes crossing the territory for 878 competitions in 50 disciplines.



KEY FACTS

Plaine Commune is at the heart of the competition. The Stade de France will host the athletics and paraathletics competitions, rugby 7s and the closing ceremonies of the Olympic Games. The new Olympic Aquatic Centre will host artistic swimming, waterpolo (preliminary phases) and diving competitions. Parc Georges Valbon will host the start of the paramarathon, which will cross the Plaine Commune territory. In addition to the investments made directly for our communities, the legacy of the Games represents a major contribution in terms of attractiveness and quality of life.

The Olympic Village, designed for post-Olympic use, will become a genuine new city district for the benefit of its residents, innovative and environmentally exemplary.

The proximity of the Pleyel district and its transport hub make this sector a place perfectly designed for future city life of the Metropolis, its residents and all economic players.

The Paris 2024 Games are also an opportunity for Plaine Commune to showcase it's unique assets for urban tourism, as an open-air museum territory. Among the gems to be discovered: the banks of the Canal Saint-Denis, from Aubervilliers to the Stade de France, marked by the Street Art Avenue and its 40 works, and Les Victoires contemporary art trail.


START: MAISON DU PROJET, PAUL ELUARD MUSEUM, **SAINT-DENIS**

STAGE 1: THE OLYMPIC VILLAGE

After the Games, the athletes' accommodation will be transformed into more than 2,200 family homes and 800 special homes for students and the elderly. 120,000 m² will be converted into business premises, offices and shops. Day-care centers, school groups, a renovated high school, green spaces, etc. will also be created. The new buildings are ecologically responsible, weatherproof and fully reversible.

STAGE 2: LA GRANDE NEF « LUCIEN BELLONI »

Located in the commune of L'Île-Saint-Denis, it has been listed on the supplementary inventory of historic monuments since 2017. In 2022, the city of Saint-Ouen-sur-Seine and basketball player Tony Parker announced the opening of a basketball and padel training academy after the Games.



LITTLE BREAK

STOP AT THE OLYMPIC AQUATIC CENTER

After the Paris 2024 Games, this facility will be the home of local residents, sports associations and students with two 50 m and 25 m swimming and diving pools. Other activities will also be programmed here. The CAO will become the centerpiece of a new living district in Saint-Denis.

STAGE 1: LE TERRAIN DES ESSENCES

During the Paris 2024 Games, it will host paramarathon events. Completely decontaminated, it will become an extension of the Georges-Valbon departmental park, where visitors will be able to enjoy relaxation areas, animal sanctuaries and educational trails to discover the fauna and learn more about how to protect our nature.

STAGE 2: THE MARVILLE SPORTS PARK

The rugby pitches and training facilities during the Games will then be used by local clubs and schools. The old swimming pool will be preserved and transformed into a public facility. It will house an indoor 33 m pool, three smaller annex pools and a wellness area (balneotherapy and fitness). Outside, the aquatic center will include a 25 m Nordic pool open all year round, and amenity areas open during the summer season (300 m pool and aqua-ludic beach with fountains and geysers), as well as two solariums.
