# OLYMPICS AND PARALYMPICS CAMES KEY FIGURES



One hundred years after the 1924 Summer Olympics, Paris is preparing to host, for the third time in its history, the world's best athletes. Unlike the 1900 and 1924 editions, the 2024 Games will also welcome Paralympic athletes. The program and map of competition venues, definitively approved by the IOC, IPC, and Paris 2024 at the end of 2020, confirm the promise of spectacular, sustainable, and environmentally friendly Games.



#### A RESOLUTELY RESPONSIBLE CONCEPT

#### **COMPETITION VENUES MOSTLY ALREADY EXISTING**

Over 95% existing or temporary venues. 39 Olympic sites, including 2 built for the 2024 Games.

#### **COMPACT AND ACCESSIBLE GAMES**

- 7km between the Athletes' Village and the heart of Paris. The Village is also less than 2 km from the Stade de France and the Olympic Aquatic Center.
- 80% of competition venues within 30 minutes of the Village.
- 22 Olympic sports out of 32 within a 10 km radius of the Village. 18 Paralympic sports out of 22 within a 10 km radius of the Village.
- 60% of athletes training within the Village itself. 100% of competition venues served by public transport. 5
- 50% women / 50% men: In Paris, they will become gender equal for the first time. 22 mixed events organized compared to 18 for the Tokyo Games.

#### **DURING THE GAMES**

## PLAINE COMMUNE AND SEINE-SAINT-DENIS AT THE HEART OF THE 2024 GAMES

- 5 CATEGORIES OF OLYMPIC EVENTS: athletics, aquatic events (artistic swimming, diving, water polo preliminary rounds), climbing, and rugby sevens.
- SEVERAL CELEBRATION VENUES:

The territory will host several celebration sites (broadcast of events, demonstrations, festive activities, etc.).

The banks of the Seine will also be places of entertainment and animation.

Several official ceremonies will also be organized on the Plaine Commune territory, whose 9 cities are labeled "Terre de Jeux 2024".

 4 CATEGORIES OF PARALYMPIC EVENTS: Para athletics, as well as the Paralympic marathon and road cycling race which will traverse the department.

42.195 km for the para marathon, including 26 km traversed in 9 cities of Seine-Saint-Denis with a passage through many emblematic sites and places honoring the territory.

**EVENT**(mass event) as well as the Paralympic marathon and road cycling races, will be an opportunity to showcase the territory to spectators and viewers worldwide.

## LIVING AND SHARING THE ADVENTURE OF THE GAMES

"Terre de Jeux 2024": a label for local authorities who share the belief that sports can change lives and who are committed to bringing the emotions of the Games to everyone.

**The "Club Paris 2024":** a club created in 2020 to allow as many people as possible to take part in the Games' adventure (preliminary information, challenges, rewards, etc.).

**Celebration sites (Live sites):** located outside competition venues, they will allow a large number of people to experience and celebrate the Games.

**Clubs 2024:** celebration sites that will offer a complete Olympic and Paralympic experience throughout France with broadcast of the Games, various activities, sports initiations and demonstrations, catering, and open meetings to all French people.

## LET'S OPEN THE CAME WIDE!



- **15 million** spectators for the torch relay and 11,000 torchbearers throughout the national territory.
- 600,000 spectators for the opening ceremony, which will span 6 kilometers along the Seine and be accessible free of charge.
- 13.5 million tickets on sale for the Olympic and Paralympic Games, with buyers from 158 different countries, including 2/3 being French buyers.
- 40,000 volunteers dedicated to organizing the Games and 150,000 people will work on organizing the events

- Over 20,000 accredited journalists.
- 350,000 hours of TV broadcasting.
- 4 billion viewers worldwide.
